E Principal's Report & Questions

1 - Name Tags

Staff will possibly start wearing name tags so they can be identified as STAFF RF has a large student body and there are sometimes non-RF people in the building so what do we think of having students wear name tags?

What might this cost? Could be up to \$5 per tag. PHRD could not handle producing the number of name tags required. Perhaps school photographer would include them in the school pic fees.

Mr. Rufiange shared the results of the RF communication survey that circulated last fall RF administration and School Council continues to work at improving communication

4 - Powerschool/Parent Portal

How many parents in attendance use/check Powerschool? The ease of use was discussed.

5 - Junior High "Communication Plan"

Mr. Rufiange has been speaking to the junior high students about Physical, Social and Sexual Harassment and is wanting to help the students develop a communication plan if they should need one. He is wanting the students to know how to communicate with a parent/friend/teacher. He spoke that the most vulnerable students fly under the radar – they are not connected to any specific 'group' – and they are often the prime targets of harassment. "Bullies are sneaky and how can a student be sneaky about communicating to get help if it's needed."

This is being addressed in TAG groups and this message will be 'blitzed' to the grade 7,8 & 9 levels individually.

7- Mr. Rufiange was asked by central office to ask the following questions:

What challenges does the RF Staff face in their efforts to bring students to success?

- > Comments from parents:
 - 'curling parents' parents who remove all obstacles for students
 - Technology students spending time on devices in the classroom for non-educational purposes. It appears that people are becoming needy of instant gratification and social media is providing that. Students are desperate to stay 'connected' as they have a fear of missing out.

What do you identify as evidence of progress toward improvement of Literacy, Numeracy, Diversity and Student - Teacher relationships so far?

- Comments from parents:
 - There was no comment about any evidence of improvement in literacy, numeracy or diversity... Concern was brought up about there not seeming to be not enough work for students to-do in a Math-3 class
 - TAG groups, flex block has promoted relationships

What one thing does the Parent Community want to focus on, which would have the greatest impact at low cost?

- Comments from Parents
 - Removal of devices in the classroom such that social media could not be accessed during class time
 - Promote Acts of Service
